IMPORTANT

PFD OR LIFE-JACKET IS REQUIRED approved by the Canadian coast guard or equivalent & fits your child

FOR BOATING, CANOE/KAYAK, SAILING, WATER-SKIING AND BOARD-SAILING.

Life jackets must be brought to camp. Wilvaken has a limited supply, so we ask parents to purchase one that fits their child. If campers arrive without one, they will be assigned a life jacket that will be used for the duration of their stay. All life jackets will be cleaned at the end of a session. There will be a small charge for the use of our life jackets due to the Covid protocols.

What not to bring to camp?

FLIP FLOPS OR SANDALS ARE NOT RECOMMENDED DUE TO THE ROUGH TERRAIN BUT MAY BE WORN TO THE BEACH OR SHOWERS

AEROSOL CANS - These include aerosol bug-sprays, perfume and sunscreens.

FOOD AND CANDY - **No food to be kept in cabins. Counsellors will collect upon arrival.** This policy has as much to do with critters as with our community.

Wilvaken is not responsible for lost or damaged personal articles, nor for any money which is not left in safekeeping at our office.

ELECTRONICS - If you bring them with you for the ride to camp, upon arrival the office will keep them safely until your departure – eg. Phones, electronic games, tablets and laptops

Valuable Jewellery, Cash

Miscellaneous valuables – travel tickets, passports, and other documents will be collected and stored in our office.

LAUNDRY – There will be no laundry service in 2021.

THE RIGHT LUGGAGE – We recommend to use a hockey style bag or large soft sided bag as they can be folded when empty. The cabins do not have room for large suitcases or plastic boxes.

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What do I bring to camp?

INTERNATIONAL CAMPERS

If you are arriving by plane then you will have to limit what you pack. Wilvaken can supply you with:

Pillow

Sheets

Towels

Sleeping bags

Life jacket

These items are available as long as we are advised ahead of time. There will be a small fee for their use as we have to launder everything after the session is over. Please let us know a week before arrival if your child will need anything.

Insurance – It will be important that you purchase medical insurance prior to coming to Canada. We will need to collect the information along with the number belonging to your insurance.
